Highlights of Classis Southwest Ontario Meeting, Tuesday, Sept. 24, 2024 hosted by Wallaceburg CRC With 25 of 28 churches of classis gathered, 57 delegates (including 7 first-time delegates), Rev. Peter H (Chair) of Compass Community Church and Rev. John M (Vice-Chair) of Covenant CRC, led us through our agenda. Delegates and guests were encouraged by a number of reports and presentations throughout the day. For more detail please refer to the Minutes which are available through your church or Ron M, Stated Clerk. The following are a few highlights.

- Classis was blessed to participate in and witness the examination of Candidate Nick V, called by Forest City Community Church (London). Nick sustained his examination, and is admitted as Minister of the Word in the CRCNA. Nick's ordination service is being planned for November 17th.
- Classis was also blessed to participate in and witness the examination of Stephanie V as Commissioned Pastor. Stephanie serves as the Director of Faith Formation and Worship at Grace Church (Chatham). Stephanie sustained her examination and is approved as a Commissioned Pastor. Stephanie's ordination service is being planned for October 6th.
- As Rev. Marcel K competed a term call at Fellowship Church (St. Thomas) in October 2021, classis approved a second one-year extension for his eligibility for call.
- As Rev. Steve D has accepted a ministry call outside of the CRCNA, Rev. D has resigned his position at Talbot Street Church (London). Classis approved the request of Talbot Street Church and Rev. D that he be honourably released from the office of Minister of the Word in the CRCNA (Art. 14-b C.O.)
- Classis approved the Auditor's Report and 2023 Financial Statements; approved increasing the classis mileage rate effective January 2025 to \$0.62/km; approved an increase in the remuneration for the Outreach Ministry Developer, Treasurer, and Stated Clerk by 2.5%; and approved the 2025 Classical Ministry Share budget. The 2025 budget is \$63.49 per member (a decrease of \$1.65/member)
- Classis elected the Officers and Directors of the Corporation for 2024-25:
 - President: Rev. Tim L (CMC Chair)
 - Secretary and Vice-All: Ron M (Stated Clerk)
 - Treasurer: Harry V (Treasurer)
- Rev. Corey V, pastor of RedeemerOnline.Church, updated classis of the successes of the ministry (now connecting with people form 81+ countries!). Classis approved three years of additional funding for this ministry from classis church plant funds.
- Classis was advised that we recently received a letter from Vitalpoint church that it is their intention to disaffiliate with the CRCNA. We will be following up with this and it will come before a future meeting of classis.
- As a result of decisions made by Synod 2024, a special meeting of classis is being planned for November 5 at Hope Community Church, Mount Brydges. The purpose is to share, listen, graciously discuss, and pray about the impact of Synod on our churches, classis and denomination.
- Classis approved that Art S (Living Hope) serve on the Nominating Committee.
- Classis is seeking people to serve as:
 - o Classical Safe Church Coordinator
 - o Deacon at Large member for CMC
 - o A member to serve on the Nominating Committee
 - o Two (pastor) Church Visitors

Highlights of Council Meeting, October 1

1. A follow up Listening Circle about Synod's decisions over the last couple of years will take place on November 10 to provide time and space for questions and concerns from the congregation.

2. A special Classis meeting is being held on November 5 at Hope Community Church in Mount Brydges. This informal meeting is being held to share, listen and pray about the impact of Synod on

congregations, classis, and the denomination. No credentials are required, no motions will be accepted or decisions made. Each church is encouraged to send up to three currently serving Council members. Pastor Joe, Martin B and Wilma V will be attending.

3. The Facilities Team is looking for an additional member with administrative skills.

4. Motion made and carried to proceed with hiring our lawyer (at a cost of approx. \$1500) to make the changes required to the Redeemer CRC bylaws to ensure compliance with the Ontario Not-for Profit Corporation Act which is comes into effect October 19, 2024. The Bylaws Team at Redeemer completed an intial review which has been submitted to the lawyer with the necessary changes.

5. Motion made and carried to approve a Long Term Office Lease Agreement between Redeemer CRC and Ashley S Counselling as presented.

6. Church Christmas dinner is scheduled for December 8. Details to follow.

7. Motion made and carried to approve an expenditure of \$10,000 to repair the sanctuary sound system.

Toward a CRC in Canada

According to the Acts of Synod, and the Q+A that was sent from the CRC office, Synod made several major decisions. These are having and undoubtedly will have profound impacts on your congregation's ministry, as well as that of other churches in your classis. Already, churches are experiencing concerns in recruiting office bearers; concerns in young persons' decisions to profess their faith, concerns about recruiting church visitors, concerns about funding local congregational and classical ministries. These are Synodical decisions that are impacting the day-to-day functioning and hopes of congregations. Toward a CRC in Canada (https://www.towardcrccanada.net/) invites you to a zoom conversation (late October/early November) about these concerns: how do and will these decisions impact us locally? We believe that an honest conversation is vital. There is no real "status quo". More information is forthcoming.
